Course Objectives

Healthcare-associated Infections (HAIs), especially caused by MDR bacteria are now challenging, including the Middle East. These are escalating, increasing patient morbidity and mortality. Some patients are faced with the nightmare of untreatable infections. Main organisms include Acinetobacter baumannii, Pseudomonas aeruginosa and Klebsiella spp. MDR HAI prevention and control requires a multi-disciplinary approach and many competencies including antimicrobial stewardship, microbiology, infection prevention and control (hand hygiene, screening and isolation) and organisational/behavioural changes, with paucity of good quality, randomized, controlled studies in the field. Carefully controlled studies testing specific interventions, or combinations thereof, are needed in different settings, including countries with middle/low resources (LMIC), testing isolation strategies, screening, prudent antimicrobial use and
